III. Narrative Writing Unit

-Writers must be able to write:

- 1) Introduction: the introduction must show what was happening and where, but also give some clues to what would later become a problem for the main character.
- 2) Body: the body must be a day in the character's life, developing characters, setting, and plot throughout the story, using descriptive words, sensory details, action, dialogue and the character's thought.
- 3) Transitions: the proper use of transitions to show how the story progresses through time: time order transitions, especially *meanwhile*, at the same time, early that morning, three hours later.
- 4) Ending: the ending must connect to the main part of the story. What the character said, did, or realized something at the end that came from what happened in the story, given a sense of closure.
- 5) Punctuation: proper use of punctuation rules.
- 6) Spelling: proper use of spelling rules.
- 7) Organization: proper use of paragraphs to separate different parts or time of the story.
